THE compilers of the following pages, in addressing their subscribers and the public, feel that they possess but few claims to their attention, upon the score of novelty in the present Work, from that of their former Commercial Directories; and, having so recently published one of the Northern Counties—to which, indeed, the Volume now laid before them may be considered as a companion, or a sequel, they have nothing to offer in the way of explanation or comment, regarding its arrangement, and but little respecting its contents. A grateful task, however, devolves upon them, which, they are sensible, should take precedence of any other observations it is to record their thanks for the wide field of patronage, that they have reaped for so many years, and for the abundant harvest of support that they have gathered, in the progress of the canvass of the midland counties, and of Wales—of which the Work now submitted is a Directory.

The descriptive accounts of the different towns and villages, though still brief, occupy a much larger space than that devoted to such particulars in former editions—and, in this department, the proprietors, as upon previous occasions, have thankfully to acknowledge the prompt and valuable assistance afforded to them, from many talented gentlemen, in furnishing to their Agents information, upon various subjects, from scarce documents, never before published, in connexion with the various places—and, which those, who have so obligingly interested themselves, will perceive has been made use of.

In respect to the Distance Tables, herein furnished, the proprietors have, in this useful department, had much to contend with, and experienced considerable anxiety. Local information has been often found to vary from actual fact, and an old distance has not unfrequently been pertinaciously adhered to, by the country resident, long after a new and shorter road had been travelled over. The standard the proprietors have set up, has been the road in most general use, except in some instances, where new ones have been struck out, making the distance longer than by the more ancient ways—circumstances like these, however, are but of rare occurrence. Allowance, in certain cases, should also be made for the length of towns passed through; admeasurements have variously been computed, by some authorities, from the extreme ends of a town, and others from its centre: these discrepancies, though unimportant, in a long and general route, have nevertheless received the necessary attention; and, upon the whole, the distances, as computed Messrs. Pigot and Co., may, with confidence, be relied upon as the criterion in travelling.

The embellishments of this volume consist of a series of Maps, illustrative of the several Counties it contains, and a large Map of North and South Wales—the whole engraved on Steel Plates, from the best and latest surveys. All the maps are bordered by the adjacent counties, with the main roads of communication distinctly laid down; and in the minor and minute details, as much information will be found exhibited, as upon maps far more costly, and of much larger scale.

In soliciting the indulgence of their subscribers and the public, to any inaccuracies that may be detected—the proprietors can only urge the inseparable difficulties attached to an undertaking like the present, in which the materials collected are so diversified, and the persons concerned in their compilation so numerous, and widely sundered. KIDDERMINSTER AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

KIDDERMINSTER is a market town and borough, having KIDDERMINSTER is a market town and borough, having separate jurisdiction, in the parish of its name, and lower division of the hundred of Halfshire; 126 miles N.W. by N. from London, 14 N. from Worcester, 3 N. by E. from Bewdley, 7 s.W. from Stourbridge, 17 s.W. from Birmingham, and 32 s. from Stafford; situate on the eastern bank of the river Stour, about three miles from its confluence with the Severn; and the Staffordshire and Worcestershire canal, passing close to the town, joins the Severn at Stourport—a conveyance by water being thereby afforded to all parts of the kingdom. The ancient name of this place w as *Chiderminster; Chid*, or *Kid*, signifying, in ancient British, the brow of a hill, *Dwr*, water, and *Minster*, a church; an etymology highly characteristic of its situation. At the time of the Conquest it was a royal manor, and continued so until the reign of Henry II, when it passed into private hands, and amongst its possessors was Waller, the celebrated poet. The town is of an irregular form, and contains several welland amongst its possessors was Waller, the celebrated poet. The town is of an irregular form, and contains several well-built and some handsome houses; but the greater part consists of dwellings inhabited by the workmen employed in the different factories. The entrances to the town are now spacious, great improvements having been made in those from Worcester, Bridgnorth, and Bewdley: it is well paved, and lighted with gas, and the inhabitants are amply supplied with water. The town-hall is a neat building of brick: the lower part is appropriated to shops, and the upper to the holding of the courts, and the transaction of the public business of the corporation: it also contains a spacious assembly room, and under the building is a small prison, for the confinement of criminals prior to their committal to the county gaol. Kidderminster received a charter of incorporation from Charles I, in the 12th year of his reign; but the charter at present in force was granted on the 31st of county gaol. Kidderminster received a charter of incorporation from Charles I, in the 12th year of his reign; but the charter at present in force was granted on the 31st of August, 1827, by which the government of the town is vested in a high steward, a recorder, a high and a low bailiff, twelve aldermen (exclusively of the high bailiff), and twenty-five assistants, with a town-clerk, constables, &c. The high bailiff, the late, bailiff, the recorder, and the three senior aldermen are justices of the peace, and hold quarterly courts of session for the borough, for the trial of all offenders not charged capitally, the Friday in the week in which the general quarter sessions are held. A court of requests, the jurisdiction of which extends over the whole parish, is also held every fortnight, by commissioners, for the recovery of debts under forty shillings; and a court-baron, by the lord of the manor (Lord Foley), occasionally. This borough sent members to parliament in the 23rd year of King Edward I, between which time and the passing of the Reform Bill it made no return; by that act it became empowered to send one member; the gentleman returned at the general election in January, 1835, was George Richard Phillips, of Weston House, in the county of Warwick, Esq. In the time of Henry VIII Kidderminster was noted for its manufactures, first of broad cloths, afterwards of wolseys, and subsequently of bombasines, crapes, and poplins; but, early in the last century the carnet business was introduced and subsequently of bombasines, crapes, and poplins; but, early in the last century, the carpet business was introduced here, and has been continued with increasing success up to the present time. In the year 1772 the town and its suburbs contained no less than two hundred and fifty looms, and since that time a larger number has been employed. At first the carpets made here were of the Scotch and flat kind; but soon the cut carpets were invented, and this sort has since

continued to be the distinguishing class of Kidderminster. Brussels carpets are also brought to great perfection here; but all the various kinds have been so much improved by the ingenuity and emulation of the manufacturers, in the variety and elegance of the patterns, as well as the permanency and brilliancy of the dyes, as to be unrivalled by any manufactory in the world. From a return to parliament it appears that, of the whole quantity of wool produced in the kingdom, one twenty-eighth part is consumed here in the weaving of carpets. On the banks of the river Stour are several dye-houses, in connexion with the various manufactories. The other principal branches of trade are those in malt, coal, and iron; and there are several corn-mills in the vicinity. The places of worship are two churches, and chapels for independents, Wesleyan methodists, unitarians, and baptists. St. Mary's, the parish church, is a spacious and venerable structure, partly in the decorated, and partly in the later style of English architecture, with a handsome square embattled tower. The chancel contains several ancient monuments and recumbent figures. The living is a vicarage with the curacy of Mitton annexed in living is a vicarage, with the curacy of Mitton annexed, in the patronage of Lord Foley, and incumbency of the Rev. Jas. Farley Turner. The new church, dedicated to St. George, was built, by a grant from the parliamentary commissioners, in 1824, at an expense of upwards of £16,000., to which was added £2,000. raised by the inhabitants: it is a handsome structure, in the later style of English architecture, with a lofty and richly ornamented tower; and, standing on an eminence, forms a prominent feature in the view of the town. The altar-piece of this church was embellished with a representation of the descent from the cross, woven in carpet work, with exquisite brilliancy of colour and elegance of design, with exquisite brilliancy of colour and elegance of design, by Mr. Bowyer, a manufacturer in the town, and presented to the parish; but this beautiful piece of workmanship, having been wantonly cut in different places by a sacrilegious outrage, the perpetrator of which has never been discovered, it was removed, and the Lord's prayer, the creed, and the ten commandments were put up in its place. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of the vicar. The charities consist of a free grammar school of uncertain origin made a royal grammar school, of uncertain origin, made a royal foundation by Charles I; national and Lancasterian schools; alms-houses, founded in 1629, by Sir Edward Blount, and others, in 1684, by H. Higgins, Esq.; a dispensary, and various charitable donations and bequests for distribution among the poor. There are several chalybeate springs in the parish; and on Burleigh common is a dropping well, the water of which is celebrated for curing diseases of the the water of which is celebrated for curing diseases of the eye. The market-place has been greatly enlarged, by the corporation, at an expense of £10,000, and is arranged in separate divisions for the various kinds of goods exposed to sale. The market days are Thursday, chiefly for corn, and Saturday, for provisions. The fairs are held on the 26th of January, the 13th of April, the 28th of May, the 20th of June, the 4th of September, and the 30th of November. The parish of Kidderminster (including the chapelry of LOWER MITTON,) contained, by the census taken in 1821, 15,296 inhabitants, and in 1831, 20,865; of which last number 17.913 were returned for the Town and Foreign. 17,913 were returned for the Town and Foreign.
